Subject: RW-21 project update
PSE&G power activation to well vault meters complete
Asphalt seam work on Emma Street, S. Pershing, and S. Sheridan Ave tomorrow

Northrop Grumman is providing this progress report to you on our activities in support of the RW-21 groundwater treatment system project. PSE&G has activated power to our three well vault electrical meters and that milestone is complete.

On Thursday, February 10, 2022, you may observe our contractors filling various asphalt seams on Emma Street as we anticipate the weather to be warmer and conducive to this kind of asphalt work. Work will begin at 8 a.m. and will be completed in one day. We will start on western end of Emma Street and finish at the northern end of S. Sheridan Ave. Please expect short-term single lane closures in the immediate work area but overall, there will be minimal traffic disruption. Flag personnel will assist drivers/pedestrians in the work areas.

Over the next few weeks, you should expect to see us working along the residential street piping route as we inspect the leak detection manholes as part of our quality controls leading to system start up in the summer.
