Subject: Theft, vandalism and trespassing at RW-22 well development location (greenway)

Yesterday at about 7:38 p.m., two teenagers trespassed in our RW-22 well development work zone (on the Town of Oyster Bay greenway access road), vandalizing and stealing our equipment. Photos captured by our newly installed surveillance system observed the teens climbing on our drill rig, swinging on wire cables, opening compartments of the drill rig, and attempting to alter the trash pump.





A traffic safety sign was cut with knife, a private property sign, drillers gloves and other worksite materials were removed from their specific location and tossed around the worksite. In addition, a hard hat was stolen.

We have contacted the Nassau County Police Department 8th Precinct POP Unit, have filed another report and are providing them with a copy of all photos.

We are cleaning up the work zone and will inspect the equipment and materials to ensure that all equipment is still in working order and that the teens have not impacted our work schedule.

We ask that parents and members of the community remind their children and other young people that it is against the law to trespass in designated work zones and tamper with equipment and steal materials that are the property of others. They could also be injured in our work zone and parents would not be aware of their children's location.
